Alcohol, Other Drugs, Gambling & Gaming Awareness



Alcohol, Other Drugs, Gambling & Gaming Awareness (AODG) is a training course of the Strengthening the Forces program of health promotion. This document summarizes the information that you should know in order to consider whether to register and, if you have registered, to start participating.

SUMMARY OF THE COURSE

The target audience of AODG is those personnel who are in a leadership position. The training is aimed at the knowledge and skills that are necessary in order to recognize and respond to the early warning signs of abuse of alcohol, drugs, gambling, and gaming.

This course is not a form of treatment or therapy. If you believe that you may have an addiction to alcohol, drugs, or gambling, you are advised to seek the care of a health care professional.

ELIGIBILITY AND REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Any local member of the Defence team is eligible to register in advance of the registration deadline and subject to course maximums. Course registration is done using a Training Request Form (TRF), available for download from both the SharePoint Base Training Calendar as well as CAF Connection (see URL below). The Base Training Officer (BTO) (Acting) will confirm your registration once it has been processed.
