

## JOINING INSTRUCTIONS

### Respect in the Canadian Armed Forces



Respect in the Canadian Armed Forces (RCAF) is an initiative of Operation Honour. This document summarizes the information that you should know in order to consider whether to register and, if you have registered, to start participating.

## SUMMARY OF THE COURSE

The target audience of RCAF is all CAF military personnel (not including civilians). With the goal in mind of a respectful climate and culture in the CAF, the training is aimed at the knowledge and skills that are necessary in order to take a stand against sexual misconduct and to support victims. Module-1 focuses on the nature and magnitude of sexual misconduct in the CAF; module-2 teaches about bystander intervention; in module-3 you will learn about victim support.

Because of time limitations the workshop does not provide a detailed account of the laws governing sexual assault nor does it address issues which influence patterns of violence and abuse in the military, such as post deployment adjustment or mental health disorders.
